Rebecca has dedicated three decades to public health as both a practitioner and as a leader of care model design innovation, health system partnership and enhancing access to high quality care. She holds a nursing degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and a Master of Public Health from Portland State University. Throughout her career, she has led transformative programs addressing the social determinants of health for at-risk populations, several of which have gained national attention.

Under Rebecca's leadership, Housecall Providers has expanded services to include a community-based palliative care program spanning seven Oregon counties, creating a full continuum of care alongside home-based primary care and hospice. She has also driven growth for the organization by partnering with payers across the state in value-based payment models that improve access, quality outcomes, and patient satisfaction.

As CEO, Rebecca has focused on fostering a more diverse and inclusive organization by strengthening partnerships with community-based service agencies, many of which serve minority and/or marginalized groups. These collaborations have expanded support networks for homebound and seriously ill individuals, ensuring they receive compassionate and culturally responsive care. In 2024, Housecall Providers was recognized as an Oregonian Top Workplaces, with 97% of employees feeling part of something meaningful and 96% affirming that the organization operates with strong values.

Outside of work, Rebecca enjoys gardening, cooking for loved ones, and traveling with her husband and two adult sons. She serves on the boards of the American Academy to Advance Home Care Medicine and Project Access NOW.
